Purpose: To recognize chapters who have made significant contributions to the Greek and University communities through collaboration and service. These chapters represent model Greek organizations. One chapter will be chosen from IFC, PHA, PHC and MCGC if organizations meet stated expectations.

Award Eligibility:

1. Chapter must be in good standing with the University and its respective Greek council.
2. Chapter must be a registered and active student organization recognized by The Ohio State University.
3. Chapter must be in good standing with its (inter)national organization.
4. Chapter must be an active member of IFC, PHA, PHC or MCGC.

Award Selection Process:

1. All applicants will be considered under their respective council for the William H. Hall Chapter of the Year Award.
2. A committee will evaluate all applications and select three semi-finalists for each award.
3. The semi-finalists will then complete an interview process and one chapter from each council will be selected for the award.

Award Submission Requirements:

Expectations for a William H. Hall Chapter of the Year candidate are listed below. These also fall in line with our Standards of Excellence. Chapters considered outstanding should meet most of the following:

- Meets points set in Chapter Plan.
- Meets points set in Recruitment Plan.
- Timely submission of reports including: Annual Chapter Report, Chapter Plan, Quarterly Standards of Excellence Reports, new member cards, and chapter rosters and officer lists.
- Free of discipline or sanctions by Greek Progress Review Board (or other judicial structure) and the University.
- Grade point average above all undergraduate average.
- Grade point average in line with high academic ideals and achievement.
- Financial management: Good financial standing and timely payment of bills (or dues) to IFC, PHC, PHA, or MCGC.
- Demonstrated efforts toward Risk Management: Chapter provides safe living and learning environment for its members.
- Demonstrated efforts towards Diversity: Chapter provides opportunities for awareness of diversity.
- Demonstrated efforts towards Community Service: Chapter provides unique and on-going service opportunities for its members.
- Active engagement of faculty, alumni liaison, chapter advocate, housing corporation, and international organization with Greek Life programs and staff.

- Chapter delegate sent to leadership activities/retreats such as Buckeye Greek Leadership Institute (BGLI) and Chapter President's Leadership Initiative (CPLI).
- Participation in Greek Activities (Homecoming, Greek Week, and other speakers/programs).
- Chapter involvement in the University/Columbus community (75% involved in at least one activity/organization).
- Regularly maintained and updated website.

Up to five awards may be presented.

Award Eligibility:

1. Chapter must be in good standing with the University and its respective Greek council.
2. Chapter must be a registered and active student organization recognized by The Ohio State University.
3. Chapter must be in good standing with its (inter)national organization.
4. Chapter must be an active member of IFC, PHA, PHC or MCGC.

Award Submission Requirements:

1. Descriptions of demonstrated innovation and/or creativity in chapter programming (internal or external), which have challenged the process. Purpose: To recognize chapters whose philanthropy programs are well planned and executed, meaning that they are open and advertised to the entire University community and well attended by the Greek and University community. Funds raised through these efforts should be donated to the chapter's philanthropy organization. Chapters can be recognized individually or jointly if chapters have paired for the project. One chapter will be chosen from IFC, PHA, PHC, and MCGC if organizations meet the eligibility.

Award Eligibility:

1. Chapter must be in good standing with the University and its respective Greek council.
2. Chapter must be a registered and active student organization recognized by The Ohio State University.
3. Chapter must be in good standing with its (inter)national organization.
4. Chapter must be an active member of IFC, PHA, PHC or MCGC.

Award Submission Requirements:

1. A cover page providing the following information:
 - Name of the event
 - Location & Date
 - Who the project benefited
 - Number of participants
 - Organizations who participated
2. A budget including goals set and the total amount donated.

Purpose: This award is designed to recognize chapters that have collaborated with one or more fraternities or sororities to accomplish a stated goal or program. One award will be presented to all chapters involved.

Award Eligibility:

1. Chapter must be in good standing with the University and its respective Greek council.
2. Chapter must be a registered and active student organization recognized by The Ohio State University.
3. Chapter must be in good standing with its (inter)national organization.
4. Chapter must be an active member of IFC, PHA, PHC or MCGC.

Award Submission Requirements:

Each participating chapter must submit a separate application to document the collaboration from your chapter's perspective. Each response must be typed and answers are limited to five total pages.

1. How was the collaboration initiated?
2. List chapters involved and their roles/responsibilities.
3. Describe the event/program with a clearly defined explanation of the planning progress, individuals impacted, and evaluation of the outcome.

PHA Conway-Chase Award - Outstanding Sorority Women of the Year

The **Conway-Chase Award** is presented annually to Outstanding Senior PHA Sorority Women and is named for Christine Conway, Ohio State Dean of Women from 1944-1967. *Applicants must be a senior graduating no later than Winter Quarter following 2008-2009 Greek Awards Celebration.*

Chase stands for the following:

C-contribution **H**-honor **A**-achievement **S**-scholarship **E**-excellence

IFC Ross Gainer - Outstanding Fraternity Men of the Year

The **Ross Gainer Award** is presented annually to Outstanding Senior IFC Fraternity Men. The award is named for Mylin H. Ross, fraternity advisor from 1949-1951, and OSU's second Dean of Men, serving from 1952-1967. "Gainer" is significant as the winner of this award shall be a "gainer" in leadership ability through his associations in his fraternity and the Greek and Ohio State University communities. *Applicants must be a senior graduating no later than Winter Quarter following 2008-2009 Greek Awards Celebration.*

PHC Outstanding Brother/Sister of Year

The **PHC Outstanding Brother/Sister Award** is presented annually to Outstanding PHC Members active in service to their undergraduate chapter, the university, and Columbus communities, in addition to maintaining academic achievement.

MCGC Outstanding Member of the Year

The **MCGC Outstanding Brother/Sister Award** is presented annually to Outstanding MCGC Members active in service to their undergraduate chapter, the university, and Columbus communities, in addition to maintaining academic achievement.

Award Eligibility:

1. Each chapter may have a maximum of two applicants.
2. Applicants must be in good standing with his/her chapter and The Ohio State University.
3. Applicants must hold a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75.
4. Applicants must be a member of an IFC, PHA, PHC, or MCGC chapter.

Award Selection Process:

4. All applicants will be considered under their respective council for the Greek Man/Woman of the Year Award.
5. A committee will evaluate all applications and select ten semi-finalists for each award.
6. The semi-finalists will then complete an interview process and up to five individuals will be selected for each award.

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Barbara J. Tootle PHA Scholarship / **IFC Scholarship**

Due March 6, 2009

Purpose: This award is based on academic performance, leadership, and financial need at The Ohio State University. A maximum of 1 member of each chapter may apply based upon GPA, academic research, professional experience (internships and employment), and a commitment to scholarship within the organization. The scholarships are two of the only four self-supported, student-run scholarships at The Ohio State University.

Award Eligibility:

1. Applicant must be an active member of a chapter in IFC or PHA.
2. Applicant must be in good standing in his/her chapter.
3. Applicant must have been enrolled at The Ohio State University for two quarters prior to receiving this award.
4. Applicant must have a cumulative GPA of at least 2.75.
5. Applicant must demonstrate high academic performance and financial need.

Award Submission Requirements:

- A recommendation letter from an advisor, faculty, or staff member at The Ohio State University submitted with the application in a signed and sealed envelope. Letter should speak to leadership abilities, academic success, and financial need.
- A current résumé.
- An official transcript sent directly to the application committee from each university you have attended.
- Please answer all of the following questions on separate pages. Each response must be typed and answers are limited to two pages per question.

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University Involvement Award

Due March 6, 2009

Purpose: To recognize Greek individuals for demonstrating excellence in involvement in the University, for activities not directly related to Greek Life. A maximum of five individuals will be awarded. Recipients of the 2008-2009 Conway-Chase, Ross Gainer, PHC Brother/Sister of the Year, or MCGC Member of the Year will not be eligible to also receive the University Involvement Award. If any applicant is a finalist/award winner for both awards, they will receive only the Greek Man/Woman of the Year Award.

Award Eligibility:

1. Applicant must be an active member of an IFC, PHA, PHC or MCGC chapter.
2. Applicant must be in good standing in his/her chapter, council, and the University.
3. Applicant must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5.

Most Improved Chapter GPA

Purpose: This award is given to the IFC fraternity, PHC organization, and PHA sorority, and MCGC chapter that has the most improved GPA from Spring 2008 – Winter 2009. For each quarter in question, the winning chapter's GPA must have been at least a 2.25.

Award For Academic Excellence

Purpose: This award is given to the IFC fraternity, PHA sorority, PHC chapter, or MCGC organization that has achieved the highest GPA of their respective council since Spring 2008 (average of chapter GPAs from Spring 2008, Autumn 2008, and Winter 2009).

Outstanding Community Service Project

Purpose: To recognize chapters whose community service projects are well planned and organized, executed in a professional matter, and well attended. The project chosen will provide valuable service, while creatively using resources available at the University and in the Columbus community. One chapter will be chosen from IFC, PHA, PHC and MCGC organizations based upon the information submitted for the Standards of Excellence as organizations meet eligibility.

Outstanding Diversity Program

Purpose: To recognize a chapter's diversity education program that is well planned, and organized by the individual chapter, executed in a professional manner, and well attended. The program should succeed in educating members of the chapter about those of a different culture, race, ethnicity, or lifestyle other than the dominant one of the chapter. The chapter should utilize resources available at the University and in the Columbus community. Outstanding Risk Management Program
