

**CODE OF ETHICS  
OF  
THE OHIO STATE UNIVERSITY  
PANHELLENIC ASSOCIATION  
(Adopted June 2, 2004)**

ARTICLE I. CODE OF ETHICS.

We the undersigned members of Women's Fraternities agree to act according to the Code of Ethics of the Panhellenic Association. We as Fraternity women will strive to:

- A. Uphold our National policies
- B. Control rumors to prevent false information being spread and to allow for appropriate intervention when rumors are confirmed
- C. Assist other chapters in a time of need
- D. Not drink before philanthropies
- E. Not to drink in letters
- F. Not to hold grudges against members who did not join our chapter
- G. Help other women
- H. Not to drink and drive
- I. Maintain aesthetic value of our chapter facilities and community by picking up trash and beer cans in front lawns
- J. Give back to the community
- K. Give back items which we have taken from other chapters
- L. Go above and beyond the Standards of Excellence
- M. Represent Greeks in a positive light in the classroom environment
- N. Attend all meetings
- O. Maintain a higher GPA than the all women's GPA
- P. Have fire safety programs
- Q. Not let pranks go too far
- R. Conduct ourselves in an appropriate manner when participating in philanthropies
- S. Put appropriate slogans on items that will represent the Greek Community
- T. Hold chapters accountable for grades of their new members
- U. Not haze
- V. Uphold our mission statement: To unify the Greek Community, both within itself and within the surrounding communities, by informing, involving, exploring, and utilizing as many resources as possible.

ARTICLE II. GUIDELINES

- A. A breach of one of these codes is in direct violation of Article II. of the Constitution of The Ohio State University Panhellenic Association and is therefore subject to judicial action.

- B. All breaches of the Code of Ethics must be reported to the Vice President of Judicial Affairs within 72 hours of the incident.
- C. The Vice President of Judicial Affairs will notify the chapter of the breach and will suggest a workshop to perform in order to foster discussions within the chapter about why upholding this code is an important part to the continued development of our community.
- D. Upon any further violations within the Vice President of Judicial Affairs's term of office, she will request to meet with the chapter president to talk about how she and the other Panhellenic Association officers can help the chapter to uphold this code.
