- 2) Ohio Union Activities Board Update Molly Murage, President
 - a) Welcome Week
 - i) This year, we hosted a successful Move In program with a Silent Disco on Friday, August 18 in the West Ballroom. We had an amazing turn out at around 800 students throughout the program and hope to make this a move in weekend staple
 - ii) Buck-I-Frenzy returned this year for the first time since 2019. OUAB sponsored a DJ, Supergame activations on the basketball and tennis courts

- as well as the zipline, and airbrushed hats. We had amazing engagement throughout the event. Numbers were a bit lower than they were in the past, but that could be attributed to the extreme heat as well as RPAC construction. Overall, this is a partnership we're excited to continue
- iii) We hosted an interactive tabling by the 18th Ave Library with a game show to promote Buckeye Kickoff and engaged with a few hundred students. This was a really great start to first day of classes as students were able to take a break between a full day of classes
- iv) Buckeye Kickoff on August 23, in the Ohio Stadium welcomed students back to campus with activities, speakers, and the marching band. Our numbers are much closer to pre-COVID numbers at around 4,000 people

b) Other Events

- i) We started our Flicks For Free series each Wednesday, on September 7th with our Movie On The Oval: Mamma Mia.
- ii) This past Monday, our concerts committee organized an R&B Silent Disco with over 300 attendees in collaboration with the student organization Society of Sisters where we announced our fall concert: A Night With Ne-Yo on Thursday, October 26. OUAB aimed to appeal to undergraduate, graduate, and professional students for the fall concert and we felt Ne-Yo's music would connect to multiple generations. We also wanted to delve into a different genre of music and felt R&B was a great fit.

c) Homecoming Week

- i) Homecoming Week starts next week and we will kick it off with Fall Fest on Siebert Lawn this Sunday October 1. The festival will feature a food truck, a mechanical bull, rock wall, caricatures, and airbrush hats. We have historically held the festival directly following the parade, but we decided to have it kickoff homecoming week to build excitement throughout
- ii) Our Annual Homecoming parade is next Friday, October 6. The route will start at the Ohio Stadium and make its way to the Union. We have about 70 entries for the parade lineup with student organizations and campus partners.

d) Organizational Updates

- i) Last week, we invited 36 new members to join our organization! We had a strong applicant pool which allowed us to bring in high quality members with varied backgrounds and experiences. Last Tuesday, we hosted a New Member mingle that gave members the opportunity to get to know one another and returning members while learning more about OUAB.
- ii) OUAB is currently in week 4 of our brainstorming timeline for the 2024 spring semester and General members are working with our programming directors to contact vendors and agencies to inquire about pricing and availability. This week, Members are starting to draft proposals in order to vote through our

e) Grad/Prof

- i) General
 - (1) We have hired a Graduate and Professional Student Employee to assist with our programming and administration of our graduate and professional student programs
 - (2) We are continuing our regular programming series like Technical Tuesdays, Wellness Wednesdays, etc. This semester, all of our Technical Tuesdays and we have seen an uptick in attendance and watching the recorded sessions after the event
- ii) Summer Programming
 - (1) We have continued hosting a variety of Summer programs which included our staple programs like quiz nights and cupcakes and canvases, but we also hosted events to get them out into the Columbus community like CAPA shows and sports games.
 - (2) We've also expanded our Summer programs to include programming around Ohio: we took students to Cedar Point, King's Island, as well as a joint trip to the Newport Aquarium in Kentucky and a Cincinnati Red's Game. We have received a lot of positive feedback around these events and plan to continue these opportunities in the future

 - (1) Filling staff vacancy on operations team
 - (2) Launching Ohio Union study this year, Ohio Union Council may be asked to serve as a focus group or to provide input on the future of the union!
- Introduction to Study using Summary, Vision and Involvement Information above
- Student engagement will be the centerpiece of the study, but staff engagement will be critical in that we will need to rely on their expertise regarding the best methods of service delivery and engagement with students.

- b) Matt Couch, Associate Dean of Students, Sr. Director of Student Activities & Student Life Orientation
 - i) General Updates and Personnel
 - (1) Student Activities has 12 professional staff positions, 1 graduate associate, and about 30 undergraduate student employees. We support the community of registered student organizations, advise the Ohio Union Activities Board and the three student governments, and operate the KBKCSLS in our mission to "facilitate meaningful involvement, community engagement and leadership development, which enable all students to contribute to a global society."
 - (2) Like the Ohio Union, Student Activities is part of the Student Engagement and Support area overseen by the Dean of Students and Associate VP for Student Engagement and Support, Dr. Danny Glassmann.
 - (3) One position is currently vacant, but we are in the final stages of hiring for that Coordinator of Student Involvement to work with OUAB.
 - (4) This summer, Student Life announced the creation of a new Conferences and Events department that will streamline the event planning process in the various Student Life venues. This will result in some restructuring of both the Ohio Union and Student Activities teams. We'll have more of an update to share about the details at our next OUC meeting.
 - (5) The state of campus involvement is quite good, considering the vast, negative effects of the COVID pandemic. Based on Student Life Survey

Results from last spring, 78.4% of all students report being involved in at least one campus activity (78.8% of undergrads, 76.1% of graduate students, and 79.7% of professional students). That's within 0.4% of our last pre-COVID report (78.8%) and above the national average of closer to 75% for 4-year institutions. We're especially focused this year on increasing student organization involvement and equipping student org leaders for success.

ii) Campus Events

- (1) We work closely with the Ohio Union Activities Board to coordinate their slate of programs, including their Graduate and Professional Student programming. We also assist with the CSA Signature Events process, providing support for the planners of those select programs that receive a special allocation from the Student Activity Fee. Student Activities also facilitates campus-wide information sharing and collaboration among departments within and outside of the Student Life that program student events.
- (2) Attendance at events during the first five weeks of the semester has been very good, highlighted by more than 10,000 at both the Student Involvement Fair and Buck-i-Frenzy (an event that been on hiatus since COVID began) and more than 3,000 at Buckeye Kick-off. Last year, OUAB hosted more than 40,000 students at more than 200 events.
- (3) Next week is Homecoming, highlighted by a Kickoff Festival this Sunday on the Siebert Lawn at Noon, the annual Homecoming Parade on Friday, Oct. 6 at 6pm, and the NPHC Step Show at Mershon Auditorium on Friday, Oct. 6 at 8:30pm. Grand Marshals for this year's parade will be Barbie and Jim Tootle, who are alumni, former staff members, and iconic Ohio State figures. After the parade, Student Life will be honoring and celebrating the Tootles as they both turned 80 this year.
- (4) Student Activities has also taken on the coordination of the Homecoming Court from the Alumni Association. Court members have been volunteering at events and launching Buckeye Funders to raise money for causes important to them. Voting on the Homecoming Royals is now available for students through Oct. 1.
- (5) We've done a number of things so far this year to make sure regional campus students are included more intentionally in Columbus opportunities, including busloads who came for Buckeye Kickoff, and a more integrated experience for the regional Homecoming Courts.

iii) Student Organizations

(1) Student Activities supports the registration and funding process for student organizations, including training for presidents, treasurers, and

- advisors, consultations for new and continuing groups, and the operation of the Keith B. Key Center for Student Leadership and Service and the Resource Room within the Center.
- (2) We have rebounded to pre-COVID levels of student organization registrations, and so far this year, we are seeing 10-year highs in programming funds requests 670 total have been submitted for fall events. Note that CSA increased the amounts of funding student organizations can request up to \$3,000 or \$4,500 (up from \$2,000-\$3,000) in programming funds depending on registration status and up to \$500 (previously \$200) in operating funds.
- (3) We are piloting the new Student Org Advantages and Rewards (SOAR) program with 150 organizations this year. This program will reward organizations for engaging in campus events, services, and activities and allow them to earn points to redeem for incentives like priority scheduling and premium placement at the Student Involvement Fair, member development grants, Resource Room line of credit bonuses, free tabling opportunities, and more. - (4) Our new hazing prevention coordinator position was established last fall, and Jaylen Lindsey has been doing great work in tandem with Becca Hamilton, who is his counterpart in a new position in Student Conduct. We are in the midst of National Hazing Prevention Week, and we've had some excellent turnout at events so far. Get more info about all our efforts and resources at http://stophazing.osu.edu.
